4. Go inside the Engine Test Cell. This is a very unique room, and important to ensure the safety of all aircraft. Look through the window at the engine being tested. What two airplanes in our Museum use engines just like this one?

5. Go back to the pick-up truck parked inside the hangar. What are 3 examples of things that this truck would have been used for by the Lands & Forests fire crews?

6. Fly over to the Otter. This airplane is riding on floats to allow it to take off and land from the water. Look at the back of one of the floats. What is the grey-shaped fin? What does it do?

7. Find the only blue airplane in the Museum. This is the Dragon Rapide. Her nickname is "Lady Faye". Where did this nickname come from?

3. Take a quick hop over to the Beaver, parked along the "shore" by the bush camp. What are the pontoon-shaped structures on either side? In what special way do they move?

2. Visit the Bush Camp. Listen to the conversations over the radio. Where is the radio office located?
